Dear Mr. McNamee:

I have received the October 6, 2000 decision of the Hearing Committee of the Professional Conduct Committee of the Alberta Teachers' Association that you have been found guilty of unprofessional conduct.

I also have received the Committee's report and findings, and have considered the recommendation that your teaching certificate be suspended. I find it appropriate to suspend your teaching authority as of the date of this letter until November 17, 2004.

Your certificate may be re-activated only upon receipt by the Registrar of a letter from the Alberta Teachers' Association that meets the following conditions.

1. The letter must confirm that you have met fully the conditions the Hearing Committee set for re-instatement of your membership in the Alberta Teachers' Association. Specifically, you are required to provide to the Association a letter from a [REDACTED] outlining the nature and extent of any [REDACTED] treatment you have received. You also are required to meet with officials of the Alberta Teachers' Association and satisfactorily demonstrate an understanding of the expectations of society and the profession in relation to interactions between teachers and students.
2. It must state that on the basis of your meeting with officials of the Alberta Teachers' Association, you have demonstrated to their satisfaction that you may be entrusted with the custody and care of students.
3. Thirdly it must state that your membership in the Association will be re-instated subject to re-activation of your teaching certificate.

In addition to the above conditions, you must promptly return your teaching certificate to the Registrar. If you have mislaid or lost your certificate, you must write the Registrar accordingly. The Registrar's mailing address is:

You may not teach in Alberta until such time as you write to the Registrar requesting re-activation of the certificate and your request is granted.
